REGULAR MONTHLY MEETING

COMMISSIONERS PRESENT: LINDA PARKER, MAYOR, BONNIE ISRAEL, RON PARKER, CAPRICE PRICE AND PHILLIP PRICE. OTHERS IN ATTENDANCE: ATTORNEY MARK EDISON

Mayor Parker called the meeting to order at 7:03 p.m.

Mayor Parker called for the minutes from the June meeting. Caprice Price made a motion to accept the corrected minutes from the June meeting. Phillip Price 2nd the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

Mayor Parker called for the treasurer's report from June. Bonnie Israel made a motion to accept the treasurer's report for June. Ron Parker 2nd the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

Mayor Parker introduced Jenny Estepp from the Bullitt County Chamber of Commerce. She informed the Commission her door was always open and welcomed questions.

Mayor Parker called for any old business.

Mayor Parker reported she attended a special meeting held by the Bullitt County Sanitation District on Friday, July 12, 2013. Since this was a special meeting her conversation with Mr. Kennedy was not a part of the meeting. However, he did tell here he was working on the application for the permit to do work on the ditch. Mr. Kennedy states the ditch is not a blue line stream. Attorney Edison stated it is a blue line stream. Furthermore, Attorney Edison stated Bullitt County Sanitation District has not secured easement to do work in the ditch. Mr. Kennedy stated he had applied for a permit over 2 years ago, which according to Attorney Edison it does not take that long to obtain a permit from the DOW. Mayor Parker has been assured she will be kept informed of the status of the application.

Mayor Parker stated MSD came into her yard to assess the manhole located inside her fence in her back yard. They had to break the manhole to get into it. When they left, they put a cone over the open manhole, which is allowing sewage gases to escape, making for a terrible stench. Mayor Parker stated she was told that Carroll Cogan has been told he must fix all issues with the sewers before the treatment plant can be sold.


Mayor Parker reported that David Hatcher from RLH has withdrawn his bid on the sidewalks. Mayor Parker stated at this time the sidewalk project will not be pursued.

Attorney Edison stated he contacted Kandie Atkinson about the City's boundaries and she stated she returned everything 3 years ago, telling what needed to be done to correct the boundaries. Clerk Daniels reported she did not receive anything back from Ms. Atkinson. Attorney Edison stated he would contact her again and see what exactly she needs, to correct the boundaries..

Mayor Parker called for any new business.

Attorney Edison gave the 1st reading of Ordinance #2013-02, setting the tax rate for Real Property for 2013. Attorney Edison gave the 1st reading of Ordinance #2013-03, setting the tax rate for Personal Property for 2013. Attorney Edison gave the 1st reading of Ordinance #2013-04 setting the tax rate for Public Service Companies for 2013.

Mayor Parker informed the Commission that the City has another federal mandate to bring all street signs up to their standard by 2015. All street name signs, stops signs, etc., must be changed to the new standard. Attorney Edison advised the City to replace the signs as needed.



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Bonnie Israel made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Caprice Price 2 nd the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 7:57 p.m.
