Mayor Parker called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.



Attorney Edison stated the County passed three ordinances which included an illicit discharge ordinance, a post construction storm water ordinance and an erosion prevention and sediment control ordinance. The County adopted these ordinances to adhere to the 2<sup>nd</sup> permit cycle. As co-permittees we stated in our part of the report we would adopt the ordinances. Attorney Edison addressed the problems with these ordinances. In 2008 there was a unified adoption of those ordinances by all the Cities and the County Attorney, who agreed on the wording and adopted them at the same time and they were published all at once. The County has already adopted and published these three ordinances without any input from the Cities. The County is basically doing 100% of the work, but in the last cycle we made sure the County indemnified the Cities, so that if they made a mistake, and one of the Cities got fined, the Cities were not held responsible.
