Minutes, September 15, 2015

REGULAR MONTHLY MEETING

COMMISSIONERS PRESENT: LINDA PARKER, MAYOR, BONNIE ISRAEL, RON PARKER, PHILLIP PRICE, CAPRICE PRICE. OTHERS IN ATTENDANCE: ATTORNEY MARK EDISON, CITY CLERK RECKA DANIELS.

Mayor Parker called the meeting to order at 7:05 pm.

Mayor Parker reported that Marty Hester had not done any more work on the ditch behind her home. After a short discussion the Commission decided to give Mr. Hester a 30 day notice to complete the work, or we would find someone else to complete the work.

Mayor Parker stated that the Pubic Service Commission gave Bullitt Utilities the right to walk away from the sewer treatment disaster, and any bills incurred. Franklin Circuit Court will meet in the coming weeks to release Bullitt Utilities from their responsibility. Per the Public Service Commission a receivership will have to be established as well. It appears that Bullitt County Sanitation District will likely take receivership of the sewer treatment plant owned by Bullitt Utilities. Per Mayor Parker she stated the surcharge has still not been approved, but likely will be. There is no indication what that surcharge will be. The sewer rates could likely increase as well.

Several residents in attendance at Hunters Hollow the meeting suggested that the City put out notices to its residents making them aware of the issues with the sewer treatment plant and suggested that residents be provided names and addresses of the PSC, EPA, our State Representative, and State Senator, etc. Mayor Parker stated there had been notices taken door to door shortly after the disaster making residents aware. She also stated the Pioneer News and the Courier Journal had covered the disaster. In addition, she had spoken numerous times with local TV stations about the disaster. Mayor Parker stated we would have a notice drawn up to inform the residents of where the situation stands. Several residents agreed to hand out the notices.
