

ORDINANCE NO. 985-48

AN ORDINANCE LEVYING AD VALOREM TAXES AND PROVIDING ASSESSMENT, EQUALIZATION AND COLLECTION.

The City Council of the City of Hunters Hollow, Bullitt County, Kentucky, does hereby ordain as follows:

SECTION I: That an ad valorem tax of \$0.198 on each \$100.00 of value of all real property taxable for municipal purposes, except property assessed by the State, in said City is hereby levied for the year 1989 and \$0.198 of each \$100.00 of value bank shares, all as of January 1, 1989.

SECTION II: Said levy is made for the purpose of raising revenue to pay salaries of officers and employees, for the repair and maintenance of streets and public ways and public buildings in said City, to pay for lighting City streets, and to pay all proper charges and legal demands against the City.

SECTION III: That the assessments made by the Bullitt County Tax Commissioner for State and County purposes for 1989 shall be and is hereby adopted as the assessment for City purposes, and the City tax book shall be made from the County list and the Tax Commissioner's books after they have been supervised and corrected by the County Board of Equalization.

SECTION IV: That the City Clerk shall take the list of all persons subject to City taxation who are not shown on the County Tax Commissioner's books and shall list all property a portion of which is in the City where the value of the portion in the City is not shown on Tax Commissioner's books.

SECTION V: The City Clerk be and she is hereby directed to prepare tax bills for all persons and organizations in the City of Hunters Hollow, Bullitt County, Kentucky, against whom taxes have been levied, and she is hereby directed to notify such persons and organization by mail that, on and after January 1, 1990, any tax bill remaining unpaid will be declared delinquent and bear interest at six percent (6%) per annum or one-half (1/2) of one percent (1%) per month or a fraction thereof until paid; and in addition thereto, a penalty of ten percent (10%) of the amount for general purposes shall be added for non-payment when due. Said Clerk shall also indicate that a discount of two percent (2%) will be allowed on bills paid before November 1, 1989.

SECTION VI: All payments of taxes provided for herein shall be made to the City Clerk/Treasurer, at the business office of the City of Hunters Hollow, 11300 Angeline Road, Hunters Hollow, Kentucky 40229.

SECTION VII: After January 1, 1990, the Clerk will mark all unpaid tax bills in red ink DELINQUENT and add a penalty of ten percent (10%) as provided herein and report to the City Council the number of unpaid bills in the amount thereof, and the Mayor will check all tax bills and correct errors, if any, and deliver the tax books back to the Clerk who will proceed with the collection of all delinquent taxes, penalty and interest, and will report to the City Council at its regular meeting each month.

SECTION VIII: The Clerk is directed to advertise the above as provided by law.

SECTION IX: Should any section, clause, line, paragraph, or part of this Ordinance be held unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the same shall not effect the remainder of this Ordinance.

Given second readings, voted upon the passed at a regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Hunters Hollow, Bullitt County, Kentucky, on the 19 day of September, 1989.
